Field Trip For Petrified Wood (short version)

On Saturday Oct. 3 we will be heading over to the Spaceport area in the search for petrified wood and

other "goodies". The Spaceport access is off I-25, exit32 to Upham, N.M.

If you Google Map this area, you will notice that the road to the Spaceport closely follows El Camino Real, full name El Camino Real de Tierra Adentro, or Royal Road of the Interior Lands. If you look even more closely you will also notice the area we will be searching also goes by the name, Jornada del Muerto, that has many different translations but Journey of the Dead, tends to sum them all up rather well. The Jornada was the most dreaded part of the Spanish trail. This 1,800-mile road, stretching from Mexico City to Santa Fe, was one of the three great trails in the American West. Although less wellknown than the Santa Fe and Oregon trails, it is, in the opinion of many historians, the most important of the three. El Camino Real was the first European trail in what would become the United States. For many years it was also the longest road in America, carrying the first permanent European settlers into this country, 22 years before the Pilgrims landed at Plymouth Rock. The first breeding stock of horses, cattle and sheep were brought into the West along this route. The wheel, written language, iron metal, the saddle, the gun, Christianity and European culture first permanently entered our country via this trail. The Jornada del Muerto is almost unchanged since 1598.

The best description I found would be,

"The roughest and deadliest part of the Camino Real, from Mexico City to Santa Fe, was the stretch between Las Cruces and Socorro called Jornada del Muerto or Journey of the Dead. A broad, flat valley with no water, grazing or firewood, it offered no amenities to travelers for 90 miles."

Caravans left the comparative ease of the Rio Grande River north of what is now Las Cruces, and prepared for a brutal, three day march with little rest and no water. Just south of Point of Rocks was a campsite known as *Los Charcos del Perillo*, or Pools of the Little Dog. The Spanish Conquistador Onate arrived here on May 23, 1598, tired and discouraged, not having found any water during the long march. As the Spanish explorers prepared for a water-less evening, a little dog came back into camp with muddy paws. They retraced the dogs' steps and found a series of shallow pools left by rains, and thus gave this campsite its name. It became a *paraje*, or camping place, where caravans watered, preparing for the harsh trip ahead.

Why did the travelers leave the river and journey into

the arid wasteland? For 100 miles, the river was too difficult to follow, especially for livestock and wooden carts. Huge canyons led from eastern and western mountains, creating gigantic ridges to climb and descend, one after another. The river often changed its course and left quicksand in its wake. What had been a safe passage on an earlier trip might lead to quicksand or be completely washed away. Despite hardships, travelers made much better time on the flat, dry valley.

In 1680, the desert route earned the name of *Jornada del Muerto*. That year, the Pueblo Indians revolted against Spanish rule, killing many foreigners and driving the rest out. Survivors gathered at *Fra Cristobal paraje*, the campsite at the northern end of the desert. More than two thousand colonists and loyal natives attempted the route to El Paso. Almost six hundred of the weak, ill or exhausted refugees died on the journey.

It wasn't until the 1880s, that the railroad laid a track through the area. One of the biggest railroad towns was Engle, built right in the middle of the Jornada. Livestock and people now traveled in hours over the *Jornada del Muerto*. Scott Ehlers
